Gentlemen:

I am a supervisor with the Maintenance and Operations department of the San Juan Unified School District.

Our District is the 10<sup>th</sup> largest in the State of California. We have more than 50,000 students. We have 79 campuses. Most of our campuses were built from 30 to 70 years ago.

We have been using the Asbestos Barrier System © for over four years, with projects ranging from single class rooms to full school modernizations. As our budget has permitted, the System has been installed in 17 different facilities, covering at this time about 150,000 square feet of asbestos laden flooring.

The system has been a substantial cost and time savings over the standard abatement process. The System is not a "temporary fix," but is a permanent solution since it need be installed only once, and new flooring can be installed over it in the future as is required.

As our budget permits in the future, we definitely will be using the encapsulation System instead of abatement. We anticipate that a new \$350 million bond measure will be placed on the ballot in November of this year. If it passes, we expect to have substantial funds to deal with our basic facility needs.
